



Notice of proposed modification to the electricity supply licence held by Project Plug Limited t/a Click Energy

NOTICE UNDER ARTICLE 14(2) OF THE ELECTRICITY (NORTHERN IRELAND) ORDER 1992

Pursuant to its powers under Article 14(1) of the Electricity (Northern Ireland) Order 1992 (as amended) (the "Order") the Northern Ireland Authority for Utility Regulation (the "Authority") hereby gives notice under Article 14(2) of the Order as follows:

- 1. The Authority proposes to modify the electricity supply <u>licence</u> (the "Licence") held by Project Plug Limited t/a Click Energy (the "Licensee"), a company established in Northern Ireland and having its principal place of business at 14 Fortwilliam Terrace, Derry, Northern Ireland, BT48 8DH
- 2. The proposed modification is to amend the financial year in condition 2.2 of the Licence. The financial year (as set out in condition 2.2 of the Licence) currently runs from 01 January to the following 31 December 01 April to 31 March each year. The proposed modification will change the financial year to run from 01 April to 31 March.
- 3. The reason for the proposed modifications is to align the company's accounting period to match that of the ROC payment cycle. The modification is being proposed following receipt by the Authority of a written request from the Licensee seeking the proposed modification to its Licence.
- **4.** The Authority considers that the proposed modification will not have any effect on any other energy supplier, or on the Northern Ireland retail energy market more generally.
- 5. The proposed modification is set out below.

Condition 2.2 of the licence shall be substituted as follows:

"The first financial year of the Licensee shall run from the date this Condition comes into force to 31 December 2015 and thereafter each financial year of the Licensee shall run from **01 April** to the following **31 March**".

6. The purpose of this notice is to bring the proposed modification to the attention of persons likely to be affected by it, and to invite representations or objections in connection thereto. In accordance with Article 14(3) of the Order, any representations or objections with respect to the proposed modification may be made on or before 21st February 2020 to:
