



Notice of decision to modify the electricity supply licence held by LCC Power Limited

About the Utility Regulator

The Utility Regulator is the independent non-ministerial government department responsible for regulating Northern Ireland's electricity, gas, water and sewerage industries, to promote the short and long-term interests of consumers.

NOTICE UNDER ARTICLE 14(8) OF THE ELECTRICITY (NORTHERN IRELAND) ORDER 1992

In accordance with Article 14(2) of the Electricity (Northern Ireland) Order 1992 (as amended) (“the **Order**”) the Northern Ireland Authority for Utility Regulation (“the **Authority**”) published a notice (‘the **Consultation Notice**’) of its intentions to modify the electricity supply licence (“the **Licence**”) held by LCC Power Limited (“the **Licensee**”).

Following the Consultation Notice, the Authority has decided to proceed with the making of modifications of the conditions of the Licence in exercise of its power under Article 14(1) of the Order.

In accordance with Article 14(8) of the Order the Authority gives notice as follows:

1. The modification will amend the financial year in condition 2.2 of the Licence. The financial year (as set out in condition 2.2 of the Licence) currently runs from 01 October to the 30 September each year. The modification will change the financial year to run from 01 April to 31 March.
2. The reason for the modification is to bring the company’s accounting period into line with the financial year end of other companies within the LCC group. The modification is being made following receipt by the Authority of a written request from the Licensee seeking the modification to its Licence.
3. The Authority considers that the modification will not have any effect on any other energy supplier or on the Northern Ireland retail energy market more generally.
4. The modification is set out below. Condition 2.2 of the licence shall be substituted as follows:

“The first financial year of the Licensee shall run from the date this Condition comes into force to 30th September 2016 and thereafter up to and including 30th September 2021 each financial year of the Licensee shall run from 1st October to the following 30th September. The Licensee's financial year starting on 1st October 2021 shall run until 31st March 2023 and thereafter each financial year of the Licensee shall run from 1st April to 31st March.”

5. In accordance with Article 14(5) of the Order, the Authority is required to consider any representations duly made. The Authority did not receive any representations or objections in the 28 days from the date the Consultation Notice was published.

6. The Authority will therefore proceed with the modification as detailed at paragraph 4 above. The modification will take effect from 18th July 2023 (Date must not be less than 56 days from date of publication of this notice).

7. The Authority has, pursuant to Article 14(8) of the Order, published this decision on its website and sent a copy of the decision to the Licensee. In addition, the Authority has provided a copy of this notice to the Department for the Economy. The Authority has also sent a copy to the General Consumer Council for Northern Ireland.
