## **NOTICE UNDER ARTICLE 8(6) OF THE GAS (NORTHERN IRELAND) ORDER 1996**

The Northern Ireland Authority for Utility Regulation (“the Authority”) hereby gives notice as follows:

- 1) The Authority, in accordance with Article 8(6) of the Gas (Northern Ireland) Order 1996 (“the Order”), has granted a licence to supply gas (the “Licence”) to EP Commodities, a.s. (the “Licensee”).
- 2) On 28 July 2023, the Authority published a notice<sup>1</sup>, pursuant to Article 8(4) of the Order, of its intention to grant the licence. The Authority asked for any representations or objections with respect to the proposal to grant a gas supply licence to be made on or before 25 August 2023. We received one response in support of the licence grant.
- 3) The gas supply licence is available to view on our website.
- 4) The Authority has sent a copy of this notice to the Licensee, the Department for the Economy and the Consumer Council for Northern Ireland.
