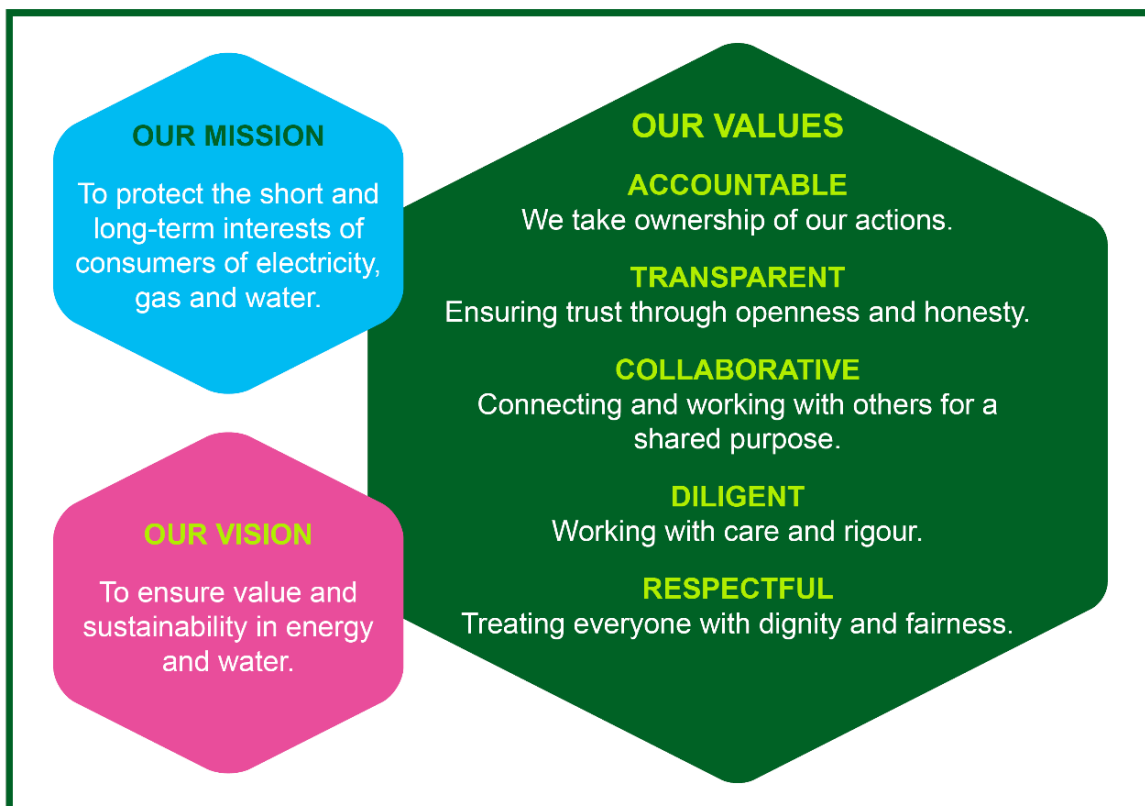
About the Utility Regulator

The Utility Regulator is the independent non-ministerial government department responsible for regulating Northern Ireland's electricity, gas, water and sewerage industries, to promote the short and long-term interests of consumers.

We are not a policy-making department of government, but we make sure that the energy and water utility industries in Northern Ireland are regulated and developed within ministerial policy as set out in our statutory duties.

We are governed by a Board of Directors and are accountable to the Northern Ireland Assembly through financial and annual reporting obligations.

Abstract

The purpose of this public notice is to bring to the attention of persons likely to be affected by the grant of the proposed electricity generation licence for Ballyutoag Wind Farm LTD and to invite representations or objections in connection with it.

Audience

Persons likely to be affected by the grant of the proposed licence referred to above.

Consumer impact

The Authority considers that the grant of the proposed licence would be an appropriate course of action for it to take. The Authority's principal statutory objective is to protect the interests of consumers of electricity supplied by authorised suppliers. This is done, wherever appropriate, by promoting effective competition between persons engaged in, or in commercial activities connected with, the generation, transmission, distribution or supply of electricity.

NOTICE UNDER ARTICLE 10(4) OF THE ELECTRICITY (NORTHERN IRELAND) ORDER 1992

Pursuant to Article 10(4) of the Order, the Northern Ireland Authority for Utility Regulation (the “Authority”), hereby gives notice as follows:

- 1) It proposes, in accordance with Article 10 (1) of the Order, to grant a licence to generate electricity to Ballyutoag Wind Farm LTD a limited company having its registered office at 1 Davies Road, Newtownstewart, Co. Tyrone, BT78 4NH (the “Proposed Licensee”).
- 2) Such licence would enable the Proposed Licensee to generate electricity at land approximately 1km north of 71 Ballyutoag Rd, Belfast, BT14 8SS for the purpose of giving a supply to any premises or enabling a supply to be so given, during the period specified in paragraph 2 of the Terms of the Licence.
- 3) The Authority considers that the grant of the proposed licence would be an appropriate course of action for it to take as such grant is in keeping with the Authority’s principal statutory objective in that it protects the interests of consumers of electricity supplied by authorised suppliers, wherever appropriate by promoting effective competition between persons engaged in, or in commercial activities connected with, the generation, transmission, distribution or supply of electricity.
- 4) The Authority further considers that the application made by the Proposed Licensee has been made in the prescribed manner and that the appropriate fee has been submitted.
- 5) The purpose of this public notice is to bring to the attention the grant of the proposed licence referred to above to persons likely to be affected by such grant and to invite representations or objections in connection with it. Any representations or objections with respect to the proposed licence may be made **on or before 23:59 on 6th June 2025**.
