Notice under Article 14(3) of The Gas (Northern Ireland) Order 1996 (as amended)

Modification Proposed to Airtricity Energy Supply (NI) Limited Gas Supply Licence


The Northern Ireland Authority for Utility Regulation (hereinafter referred to as the "Authority") hereby gives notice under Article 14(3) of the Order as follows:

1. It proposes to make a modification to the gas supply licence (the "Licence") held by Airtricity Energy Supply (NI) Limited (the "Licensee")
2. The proposed modification is to the designated area and premises as set out in Schedule 1 of the Licence. The modification proposed is shown in yellow highlight in the proposed revised version of Schedule 1 as set out in Annex 1 to this notice.
3. The reason for the proposed modification is to clarify the type of customer to which the Licensee may supply gas under the conditions of their Gas Supply licence.
4. The effect of the proposed modification will be to exclude the Licensee from supplying gas to customers in the Greater Belfast area whose consumption of gas at any premises is not reasonably expected to exceed 732,500 kilowatt hours in any period of twelve months.

ANNEX 1 – THE PROPOSED MODIFICATION

SCHEDULE 1 **Designated Area and Premises**

- 1 The premises designated as a term of the licence in this Schedule 1 are any person or premises:
 - (a) in the Greater Belfast Area, excluding consumers whose consumption of gas at any premises is not reasonably expected to exceed 732,500 kilowatt hours in any period of twelve months; and
 - (b) in the Ten Towns Area:
 - (i) commencing from and including 1 October 2012 in respect of all Large Industrial & Commercial Premises; and
 - (ii) commencing from and including 1 April 2015 in respect of all premises
