Legislation underpins the control of certain activities related to the electricity industry (prohibited activities). There are several main pieces of applicable legislation when considering whether a licence is required for the activity you wish to carry out:

- The Electricity (Class Exemptions from the Requirement for a Licence) Order (Northern Ireland) 1999 (as amended)
- The Electricity Order (Northern Ireland)1992 (as amended)
- The Energy (Northern Ireland) Order 2003 (as amended)
- The Electricity (Applications for Licences and Extensions of Licences) Regulations (Northern Ireland) various years check for latest publication.
- Electricity Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2007
