Note to staff - National Fraud Initiative 2012

The Utility Regulator is required to share payroll data to assist with the promotion of proper spending of public money prevention and detection of fraud.

Direct Utility Regulator employees will be instructed on their September payslips and accompanying emails to make themselves aware of this information.

The Utility Regulator is required by law to protect the public funds it administers. We may share information provided to us with other bodies responsible for auditing or administering public funds, in order to prevent and detect fraud. We are required to participate in a data matching exercise and so must provide particular sets of data for matching. For this initiative, we are providing details of staff on our payroll.

The data matching exercise will be carried out by the Comptroller and Auditor General under Articles 4A to 4G of the Audit and Accountability (Northern Ireland) Order 2003. Because it will be carried out with statutory authority, individual consent relating to the use and release of data is not required under the Data Protection Act 1998, however we have a duty to inform staff.

Data matching involves comparing computer records (usually personal information) held by one body against those held by the same or another body to see how far they match, identifying fraudulent claims and payments. Where a match is found it indicates that there may be an inconsistency requiring further investigation to ascertain whether it is as a result of fraud, error or there is another explanation.
