About the Utility Regulator

The Utility Regulator is the independent non-ministerial government department responsible for regulating Northern Ireland's electricity, gas, water and sewerage industries, to promote the short and long-term interests of consumers.

NOTICE UNDER ARTICLE 10 OF THE ELECTRICITY (NORTHERN IRELAND) ORDER 1992

The Northern Ireland Authority for Utility Regulation (the **Authority**) hereby gives notice as follows:

- 1) The Authority, in accordance with Article 10(1)(c) of the Electricity (Northern Ireland) Order 1992 (the **Order**), has granted a licence to supply electricity (the **Licence**) to Statkraft Markets GmbH (the **Licensee**).
- 2) The premises to be supplied are set out in Schedule 1 of the Licence.
- 3) On 17 February 2021, the Authority published a <u>notice</u>¹, under Article 10(4) of the Order, of its intention to grant the licence. The Authority asked for any representations or objections with respect to the proposal to grant an electricity supply licence to be made on or before 19 March 2021. We did not receive any responses.
- 4) The consolidated Licence is also available on our website.
- 5) The Authority has sent a copy of this notice to the Licensee, the Department for the Economy and the Consumer Council for Northern Ireland.
