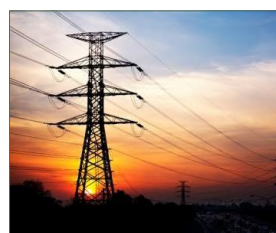


**Notice of proposed modification to
the electricity supply licence held
by Gaelectric Green Energy
Limited**

12 August 2016

NOTICE UNDER ARTICLE 14(2) OF THE ELECTRICITY (NORTHERN IRELAND) ORDER 1992

In pursuance of its powers under Article 14(1) of the Electricity (Northern Ireland) Order 1992 (as amended) (the “**Order**”) and having obtained the consent of the Licensee, the Northern Ireland Authority for Utility Regulation (hereafter referred to as the “**Authority**”) hereby gives notice under Article 14(2) as follows:

- 1 The Authority proposes to modify the electricity supply licence (the “**Licence**”) held by Gaelectric Green Energy Limited (the “**Licensee**”), a company established in Northern Ireland and having its principal place of business at 2nd Floor Princes Dock, 14 Clarendon Road, Belfast, Northern Ireland, BT1 3BG.
- 2 The proposed modification is to amend the financial year in condition 2(2) of the licence. The financial year in the licence currently runs from 01 January to 31 December each year. The proposed modification will change the financial year to run from 01 April to the following 31 March.
- 3 The reason for the proposed modification is to align the financial year in the licence to Gaelectric Green Energy Limited’s own statutory financial year. The modification is being proposed following a written request from the Licensee.
- 4 The Authority considers that the proposed modification of the licence would be an appropriate course of action in order to align the financial year with the licensee’s own statutory reporting period of 01 April to 31 March.
- 5 The Authority considers that the proposed modification will not have any effect on any other energy supplier or on the Northern Ireland retail energy market.
- 6 The proposed modification is set out below.

Condition 2(2) of the licence shall be substituted as follows:

“The first financial year of the Licensee shall run from the date this Condition comes into force to **31 December 2010** and thereafter each financial year of the Licensee shall run from **01 April** to the following **31 March**”.

- 7 The purpose of this notice is to bring the proposed modification to the attention of persons likely to be affected by it, and to invite representations or objections in connection thereto. In line with Article 14(3) of the Order, any representations or objections with respect to the proposed modification may be made on or before 12 September 2016 to:
